Communication and Language

Little Wandle Phonics and Reading

Phoneme Sounds: ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, oo, ar, or, ur, ow, oi, ear, air, er,


Tricky Words: was, you, they, my, by, all, are, sure, pure

Reading Books: Your child will have a reading for pleasure book from the library for you to share with them. They will also have a Little Wandle scheme book to read to you using the phonic knowledge and skills they have developed.

Rhymes and Songs

Nursery Rhymes- 5 little men in a flying saucer, a chubby little snowman, Polly put the kettle on, Row, row your boat, The Grand Old Duke of York,

Songs- I hear thunder, This is the way we cross the road (Mulberry Bush), Hokey- Cokey, The wheels on the bus, Down by the station, She'll be coming round the mountain



Writing

Using graphemes learnt during phonics to write small words in short phrases.
 Writin labels and postcards

Purpose: Writing to inform

Physical Development

Gross Motor – Gymnastic movement and shapes. Continue to refine fundamental movements- skip, jump, hop, crawl, balance, climb and cross body co-ordination. Develop basic ball skills- kicking, throwing and catching

Fine Motor- Pencil control, letter formation, manipulating malleable materials and using scissors.

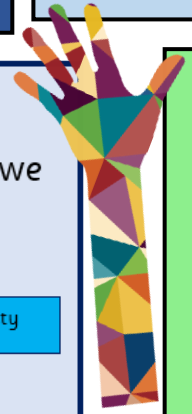
