Communication and Language

- Take turns in conversation.
- Listen and ask questions.
- Retelling known stories using storybook language.
- Language of time and using time connectives.

Little Wandle Phonics and Reading

Phoneme Sounds Consolidation: ai, ee, igh, oa, oo, oo, ar, or, ur, ow, oi, ear, air, er,

Tricky Words: Consolidation of all words taught so far for automatic word reading and secure spelling.


Reading Books: Your child will have a reading for pleasure book from the library for you to share with them. They will also have a Little Wandle scheme book to read to you using the phonic knowledge and skills they have developed.

Rhymes and Songs

Nursery Rhymes-

5 little peas, 10 fat sausages, 10 green bottles, Mary- Mary Quite Contrary, Rock a bye baby, Dr Gloucester

Songs- In and Out the Dusty Bluebells, What time is it Mr wolf?, Down at the bottom of my Garden, Hot Cross Buns.



Writing

Using graphemes learnt during phonics to write small words in short sentences.
Sequencing simple instructions.

Purpose: To inform

Physical Development

Gross Motor – **Gymnastic** movement and shapes. Continue to refine fundamental movements- skip, jump, hop, crawl, balance, climb and cross body co-ordination.

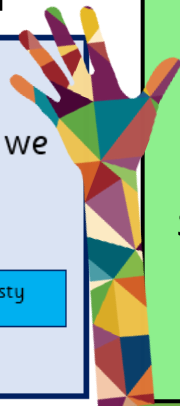
